Art and Nature Science for Children

Prerequisites: None

Ages: 6-8

Tuition: \$128.00

Materials Fee: \$30.00

Children love to create and explore nature! Let's take advantage of their creative stage and teach science and art skills for life. In this class, children will learn the basics of drawing, color, texture, shading and perspective while observing and learning about birds, animals, insects, trees and plants. We will work with markers, pencil, watercolor, pastel, and mixed media. They will have their own Nature/Art Notebook to bring home and use as a reference in future artistic endeavors, as well as several beautiful compositions suitable for framing or entering in your local county fair! You shall be amazed at the art your child brings home! Unleash your child's creativity!

Children's Year

Prerequisites: None

Ages: 3-5

Tuition: \$128.00

Materials Fee: \$20.00

Children's Year is a one-hour enrichment course for our youngest students to explore the alphabet (sounds and formation of letters), seasons and months of the year, and the days of the week in concrete, imaginative, and exciting ways. Our children will enjoy listening to stories, making crafts, and singing songs. There will be no required homework, although a worksheet will be provided to review the letter work taught in class that week. Parental involvement is always welcome and available parents will be asked to assist the teachers once or twice during the course of the year.

Before becoming a full-time mom, Jeanette worked for the CIA for 15 years as an analyst. This is her fourth year teaching with the Classical Cottage School.

Classical Studies I: Greek History & Mythology

Prerequisites: None

Ages: 8-10

Tuition: \$128.00

Materials Fee: \$15.00

This is the first course in a 3-year Classical Studies cycle (although students do not necessarily need to take these classes in chronological order). Children will explore Ancient Greece with an emphasis on mythology, culture, geography and history. They will learn about famous people, places, and events by creating a timeline and a copybook in class. Half of each class period will focus on the stories of Greek mythology as presented in D'Aulaire's Book of Greek Myths.

Angie Steele is a home school mother of five. She earned an undergraduate degree in English and a Master's degree in Reading Specialization. She is a certified elementary teacher with ten years of teaching experience. This will be her 4th year teaching at the Classical Cottage School.

Discovering the Great Artists

Prerequisites: None

Ages: 8-10

Tuition: \$128.00 This class meets 3 times a month for 1 1/2 hours.

Materials Fee: \$25.00

Students will experience the styles and techniques of the great masters from the Renaissance to the present. Students will explore the artists' backgrounds and critique some of their works of art. The majority of each class time will be spent in a hands-on activity to explore the styles and techniques of the artists while allowing for individual creativity.

Early American History

Prerequisites: None

Ages: 5-7

Tuition: \$128.00

Materials Fee: \$25.00

This class is a literature-based approach to learning American history for young children. The students will learn about our nation's history as they listen to "living" books about famous Americans and key events. Beginning with the Vikings and the discovery of North America, class will progress through the Colonial Age and the founding of our nation, finishing with Abraham Lincoln and the Civil War. The class will also include activities to reinforce and supplement the readings. The children will create their own Early American History Book, completing pages weekly. Homework is optional.

Mimi Larsen is a home school mother of six. She earned her BBA from the College of William and Mary. This will be her third year teaching at the Classical Cottage School.

Elementary Grammar A

Prerequisites: It is recommended that the child have completed Jesse Wise Bauer's First Language Lessons or have had similar grammar instruction before beginning this class. Please contact the teacher to discuss this recommendation if you have any questions.

Ages: 8-10

Tuition: \$80.00 for 32 1/2 hour sessions

Materials Fee: \$10.00

Elementary Grammar A will teach the child grammar and writing skills covering a wide range of topics, which include: parts of speech, sentence diagrams, and skills in beginning writing, story telling, and narration. Students will memorize the definitions of various parts of speech and be able to diagram basic sentences. We will use the Four-Strand Approach as recommended by Jessie Wise Bauer: memory work, copy work and dictation, narration, and grammar concepts. A weekly homework page is given to the students, which will take approximately 30 minutes to complete.

Elementary Grammar B

Prerequisites: Students should have had some previous similar grammar instruction before signing up for this class. Please contact the teacher to discuss this recommendation if you have any questions.

Ages: 9-11

Tuition: \$80.00 for 32 1/2 hour sessions

Materials Fee: \$10.00

Elementary Grammar B is a continuation of Elementary Grammar A, but not a pre-requisite. We will continue to build upon the child's grammar and writing skills covering a wide range of topics with more detail. These include: parts of speech, sentence diagrams, and skills in beginning writing, story telling, and narration. Knowing the definitions of the various parts of speech, students will be able to diagram more complex sentences. We will use the Four-Strand Approach as recommended by Jessie Wise Bauer: memory work, copy work and dictation, narration, and grammar concepts. A weekly homework page is given to the students, which will take approximately 30 minutes to complete.

Elementary World Geography

Prerequisites: None

Ages: 9-11

Tuition: \$128.00

Materials Fee: \$25.00

This class is designed for upper elementary school students who are interested in exploring the world. Students will learn the basics of geography as well as locations of continents, countries, mountains, deserts, bodies of water, and other physical features. We will do an overview of each continent. Homework will be approximately 1/2 - 1 hour per week and will consist mainly of labeling and memorizing maps. No prior knowledge of geography is required.

Janette Cascio is a professional cartographer and received a B.A. in Geography from Mary Washington College. She worked at the Defense Mapping Agency for four years doing air photo interpretation and at the U.S. Geological Survey for 12 years doing map revisions, mapping standards, and civil applications of data. This is her 5th year teaching Geography at the Classical Cottage School.

Exploratory French

Prerequisites: None

Ages: Level A is for ages 4-6. Level B is for ages 7-9.

Tuition: \$80.00 for 32 1/2 hour sessions

Materials Fee: \$38.00 includes workbook and flashcards

This fun introduction to the French language will be offered at two different age levels. Using the Syntalk method, vocabulary is introduced through actions, games and flashcards. All the vocabulary presented is relevant to the child's world. Each week, students will review the vocabulary at home with their parents, making the 1/2 hour class more effective and enabling parents to learn alongside their child.

Level A: Students will sing songs and play games to reinforce vocabulary. Homework: Reviewing flash cards using a pronunciation guide twice a week.

Level B: Flash cards introduce basic sentence structure, while students play games, do crafts and color while immersed in French. Homework: Reviewing flash cards using a pronunciation guide twice a week.

Aurelie Schmid is a native French speaker and mother of 3 children. She has been teaching French to home schoolers since she moved to the United States about 11 years ago. She has taught at the Classical Cottage School for 6 years, but discovered the Syntalk method two years ago and loves how it has impacted her class.

Exploratory Spanish

Prerequisites: None

Ages: Level A is for ages 4-6. Level B is for ages 7-9.

Tuition: \$80.00 for 32 1/2 hour sessions

Materials Fee: \$20.00

Caroline Spinney

This class is an introduction to Spanish for Grammar School children. It will introduce students to useful vocabulary via games, story books and songs while children develop an ear for the language. Spanish B follows Spanish A but there is no prerequisite for either class. No outside work is required for this class. This class will not meet the first day of either semester.

Caroline Spinney is the mother of 5 children and has been homeschooling for 17 years. She grew up in a bilingual home where she learned Spanish. She furthered her Spanish studies while attending Harvard University.

Great Books I (Year 1 Rotation)

Prerequisites: None

Ages: 4-5

Tuition: \$128.00

Materials Fee: \$15.00

In Great Books I your child will be exposed to literature of enduring value. We will discuss different elements of age-appropriate stories such as the setting, the action, or the characters. Students will compare and contrast different stories and discuss how each one makes them feel. We will also introduce different literary devices and concepts as relevant to the story and age appropriate. Poetry memorization and recitation, and a craft related to the story may be included on different weeks. Great Books is certainly a GREAT class! If your child was in Great Books I, Year 2 in 2009, all new literature will be presented in our Year 1 rotation in 2010.

Jody Shippa received her Masters Degree in Occupational Therapy from Shenandoah University. Practicing Occupational Therapy was a love, but now she remains busy homeschooling her 4 children and helping on their family farm. You can find her morning and night out in the barn milking her dairy goats. Jody has been involved in the Classical Cottage School for the past 6 years; she and her children love the school and all it has to offer. She is looking forward to teaching Great Books again this year.

Great Books II (Year 1 Rotation)

Prerequisites: None

Ages: 6-7

Tuition: \$128.00

Materials Fee: \$15.00

Kim Schatz

Great Books II, Year 1 is the first year of the 3-series Great Books classes at CCS and will nicely enhance your read-aloud time to your child at home. Students will enjoy listening to great stories along with discussion and analysis of literature that is age appropriate and of enduring value. The students will be exposed to a variety of literary genres, classical works, and poetry and will be exposed to literary structures and devices. Opportunities to practice oratory skills are presented through narration, class discussion, and oral presentations and a story-related activity is included to enhance the discussion. Each course is developed for a two-year cycle, which eliminates duplication of the materials and allows a student to benefit from each class for two years. There is no homework requirement for Great Books II.

Kim Schatz is a home schooling mother of two who has a degree in Government and Politics from the University of Maryland. Kim worked 16 years for the federal government including international assignments. This will be her fifth year teaching Great Books/Socratic Way Books at the Classical Cottage School.

Great Books III (Year 1 Rotation)

Prerequisites: None

Ages: 8-9

Tuition: \$128.00

Materials Fee: \$15.00

In Great Books III, students will investigate a variety of literary genres, classical works, and poetry with longer, more mature readings than were presented in Great Books I and II. Some chapter books may take several weeks to complete. Opportunities to practice oratory skills are presented through narration, class discussion, and oral presentations. Please note that Year 1 will include all new reading material than what was covered in the Year 2 class in 2009-10.

Rachel Mickahail has been homeschooling her six children for over twenty years; three have graduated from college and three attend the Classical Cottage School. Rachel was educated in colleges in both the U.S. and Israel including Grace University, Moody Bible Institute, and the University of Minnesota where she majored in Bible, Hebrew, and Jewish Studies. She enjoys literature and reading aloud to her children. This will be Rachel's seventh year teaching in the Great Books series.

Learning Through Literature I

Susu Jennings

Prerequisites: None

Ages: 9-11

Tuition: \$128.00

Materials Fee: \$30.00

With a focus on Newberry award winning books, this course is designed for the student ready to take on the task of learning to gather information from the reading in order to begin writing paragraphs and papers. The students will be developing the fundamental skills necessary to recognize literary elements of a story, such as foreshadowing, character description, conflict, and theme. They will learn to write notes in the book as well as highlight information for class discussion and for writing papers. Weekly classroom participation will be expected as we discuss the book, take notes, and review vocabulary. In class projects will be designed to teach the students to interact with and understand the story. At home, students will read weekly from the literature and answer questions which will be discussed in class. Therefore, students are expected to come to class with homework completed and ready to learn. As the students read from the book, they will learn to write paragraphs that analyze an element of the story. There will be one paragraph essay per book. This class is geared for ages 9-11, and is considered a bridge class to the Upper School curriculum.

Susu Jennings has a BS in Commerce from the University of Virginia, and is a Certified Public Accountant who has worked in government contracting for over 20 years. She has been writing since she was six, and is currently a member and student of the Christian Writer's Guild. Her writing has been accepted into magazines such as Pray! and Light and Life.

Living Math

Prerequisites: Children must have a good grasp on the concepts of addition, subtraction, multiplication, division and fractions.

Ages: 9-11

Tuition: \$128.00

Materials Fee: \$20.00

"Beauty in mathematics is seeing the truth without effort" - George Polya Living Math will use literature and history to humanize math, make it come alive and provide a context to enjoy and retain learning. In the first semester we will cover the ancient roots of mathematics in various cultures, from Africa and Mesopotamia to the Egyptians and Greeks. In the second semester we will move into the Alexandrians and Medieval Math. This class is by no means meant to take the place of a good math curriculum at home but will serve to enhance it and provide a different perspective on a subject which kids often find tedious and dull. Homework will be assigned regularly but should require no more than 30 minutes to complete Also, there may be a project at some point during the year.

Jen Wright received her Bachelor's of Science in Industrial and Systems Engineering from Virginia Tech. She worked as an Operations Research Analyst and an Applications Programmer for US Airways and EDS and most recently held a Web Survey Programmer position with a Market Research Firm in Great Falls, VA. She has been homeschooling her 4 boys for the last 4 years. This is Jen's second year teaching at the Cottage School.

Music in the Afternoon

Prerequisites: None

Ages: Level A is for ages 5-7. Level B is for ages 8-10.

Tuition: \$80.00 for 32 1/2 hour sessions

Materials Fee: \$10.00

We will learn many traditional children's songs and circle games while learning a bit about Western classical music. Each week the children will learn about and listen to a different orchestral instrument, and will learn to listen to music with imagination. We will touch on choral music, opera, various interesting anomalies (bagpipes, for example!), and the classical composers. (Yes, young kids can identify the difference between music from the Baroque and Romantic periods!). But mostly we'll sing and play!

Wendy Gooditis comes from a long line of music teachers and musicians. She herself plays the French horn and piano, and was trained classically in voice as well. Wendy loves helping kids find joy in music -- when they're small primarily in children's songs, music games, and folk songs, and when they're older in the careful and conscious listening which deepens the emotional experience of classical music.

Penmanship

Boo Bennett

Prerequisites: None

Ages: 8-9.

Tuition: \$80.00 for 32 1/2 hour sessions

Materials Fee: \$25.00

Printing and handwriting can be a lot of fun -- and a source of real pride. It takes less than a dozen strokes to write the entire alphabet. There are specific "doodles" to aid in the transition from printing to cursive and in cursive precision. In this class your child will learn to sit properly; hold the pencil properly; slant the paper; placement of the non-writing hand for easy-across-the-paper movement; even proper feet position! The basic approach uses large letter size for young eyes and hands and focuses on comparisons of similarities and differences between letters. Each new letter will be demonstrated and followed by close supervision each time it is presented. Letters that follows are carefully planned in order to build on strokes already learned. Quotations, statements of truth, and biblical verses will make up the copy work in the class. Moderate-to-light weekly homework is required.

Mary Frances "Boo" Bennett graduated from Ohio University with a degree in Journalism. She worked as a copywriter, art director, and direct-mail production manager during her career in advertising in Washington, D.C. Also known as Mom to Timothy and Robert, this is her sixth year at CCS. Her handwriting skills are credited to the good Catholic sisters of St. Mary's Parish, Piqua, Ohio

Poetry

Jeanne Delaney

Prerequisites: None

Ages: Poetry Primer is for ages 5-7 (mature prereaders). Poetry for Young People is for ages 7-11.

Tuition: \$80.00 for 32 1/2 hour sessions

Materials Fee: \$25.00

Language development is significantly enriched by exposure to good poetry. Poetry conveys the rhyme and reason of life in concentrated and memorable form. Each week, the children will be exposed to classic works by some of the best poets in history. By hearing a variety of poems, they will have access to a richness of vocabulary and syntax in simple patterns, preparing them for the next level of sophistication. The goal is to instill a love of poems so that they can later benefit from deeper, classical works. The poems will be enhanced by illustrations and/or dramatic readings. The students will also be

encouraged to share in discussions on meaning and interpretations of the works read. Secondly, poems, being perfect for memorization, will be provided each week using the Mastery Learning method by IEW. Memorization will be fun, and provide children a chance to learn and maintain these language patterns. A daily 10-minute practice of the weeks' selection will be required for homework. The selections read and memorized will differ from those provided in last year's Poetry classes. Those classes are not a prerequisite; this is simply an expanded continuation of the same important concepts with additional emphasis on exposure and interpretation of classic poems. A notebook will be provided of all poems selected for interpretation and memorization.

Jeanne Delaney lives in Berryville with her husband William and has six kids. One daughter and son are college age and another son is in High School. She home schools her three younger daughters. This will be her sixth year at CCS and third year as a teacher in the Grammar school. Jeanne graduated from California Polytechnic University with a degree in Business Administration and a minor in the Science. She worked as a Material Operations and Production Planner until 'retiring' to raise her children.

Prima Lingua Latina I

Prerequisites: None

Ages: 6-7

Tuition: \$80.00 for 32 1/2 hour sessions

Materials Fee: \$10.00

Prima Lingua Latina is an introduction to Latin and a preparatory course for students who plan to continue taking Latin in the Upper School. Using much of the same vocabulary in the first 6 chapters of the Upper School text, Lingua Latina, students will learn basic grammar, declensions, and Latin sayings. Students in this class will also be introduced to the geography of Rome, Roman culture and history, and Latin songs and prayers.

This phonics based spelling program is a fun half hour class which will include some phonics review, fun games and spelling drills. Words will include short vowels, long vowels, special sounds, blends, adding a

suffix to the root words, sight words, and some homonyms. Weekly review at home is encouraged. A phonics background is helpful but not necessary.

This class will cover the ancient world from 6000 B.C. to 400 A.D. We will learn what happened to Anansi the Spider in the village of the plantains, how a six-year-old became the last emperor of Rome, and many other wonderful historical facts. Our class includes: listening to the weekly stories, map work, and many weeks will include craft activities. We will use the text Story of the World Vol. 1. You may find having the text at home to be helpful, but it is not a requirement. There will be very little work assigned to be completed at home.

Kristi Coons is a home school mom of twins and a certified teacher (K-4) with over 6 years of experience. Kristi and her family are returning to Classical Cottage School for their third year participating in the program and Kristi's second year as a CCS Instructor. She has a Bachelor's degree in Psychology and an Elementary Education Certification from Shenandoah University.

Supervised Play

Ages: Intended for ages 7 through 14. Ages 5-6 may only attend if accompanied by a parent/adult.

Tuition: \$30.00 Number of sessions TBD

Materials Fee: None

This group comes together for 90 minutes of physical activity and games. It is an opportunity for students to exercise and enjoy friends after a full day of academic classes. The games are chosen by the students, although a wide variety of sports and activities will be encouraged. Each student, regardless of age, is expected to participate in the day's activities. This class will meet on the CCS grounds, weather permitting. (This decision will be made by the teacher no later than lunchtime of that day.) Also, this class does NOT meet on the days that we have Roman Culture.

The Star Spangled State Class

Materials Fee: \$30.00

This course will provide a fun and effective way for kids to learn about United States geography. Join us as we travel from coast to coast, learning about the 50 states and following the course of American history and geography. Two states will be covered each week, and many exciting games and activities will be included to take the tediousness out of learning this important information. Each child will receive a blank US map and their own copy of The Star Spangled State Book, which is a beautiful full color book with pages for each state. Optional worksheets will be sent home each week. No homework is required, but all students should review the states learned each week at home. B level students will derive the maximum benefit from this course if they complete the worksheets.

Nursery

Study Hall

Study Hall is intended for students who are mature enough to sit and work independently for an entire hour. They must bring enough work to occupy their time and understand that Study Hall is not a social hour. Our Study Hall Monitors do not assist with schoolwork.
